Literacy Resource Adoption

Our district has embarked on a thorough review of literacy resources in preparation for a literacy adoption kindergarten through eighth grade. The process began over 18 months ago when members from the Teaching and Learning team began researching effective literacy programs. Literacy Coaches and Administrators participated in structured literacy training called LETRS (Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling). This course provided coaches and administrators deep knowledge enabling them to be literacy and language experts in the science of reading and structured literacy. Across the district, teachers have been participating in a professional development series on the shifts needed to move from balanced to structured literacy led by building literacy coaches.

The team then collaborated with multiple districts

to identify the literacy resources that were used in Cook,
DuPage, and Will
County school
districts resulting in the identification of fourteen resources used across county



schools. Next, they identified priorities ensuring that the programs to be reviewed were engaging, rigorous, equitable, integrated technology and critical thinking, and offered instruction in both English and Spanish. The original list was narrowed down to six, based on the identified criteria, and a team of coaches and administrators engaged in a preliminary review of six literacy resources using the Reading League's literacy adoption rubric in the Spring of 2023. After presentations from all six vendors, the list was narrowed down to two resources that met all of the initial criteria identified. During the fall of 2023, a team of approximately 45 teachers were selected to engage in a further review of the two resources that fit the criteria identified by District staff.

The team of teachers has engaged in an understanding of structured literacy, a review of the

Reading League's literacy adoption rubric, site visits, modeled lessons, and will use the rubric in December 2023 to identify which resource best meets the needs of the students in District 100. We are proud and thankful to the team of teachers for their hard work in selecting an equitable resource for students.

Commendable Designations

The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) released the annual School Report Card for the 2022-2023 school year. The Report Card shows how well schools are progressing on a wide range of educational goals and includes valuable information about school districts including academic progress, student and staff characteristics, attendance, accountability, and finances. Academic performance is based on the 2023 Illinois Assessment of Readiness and Dynamic Learning Maps Alternate Assessment proficiency scores for 3rd through 8th grade students. District 100's data shows that our overall academic performance has improved since last year in English Language Arts (ELA) and Math. Student proficiency in ELA increased by 3%, from 21% in 2022 to 24% in 2023. In math, the district increased from 20% to 22% proficiency, and in science, overall proficiency was 44%, down 4% since last year. The growth percentile for the state was 50% in both ELA and Math. District 100 exceeded the state growth percentile in math at 53% and was just under in ELA, with a growth percentile of 48%. In other notable areas, our teacher retention increased to 86%, up 4% from last year, and our percent of adequacy for school funding is 72%, an increase of 1% since 2022.



Illinois School Designations


Exemplary – Schools performing in the top 10 percent of schools statewide with no underperforming student groups.

Commendable – A school that has no underperforming student groups and whose performance is not in the top 10 percent of schools statewide.

Targeted – A school in which one or more student groups is performing at or below the level of the "all students" group in the lowest performing 5 percent of schools.

Comprehensive – A school that is in the lowest-performing 5 percent of schools in Illinois.

Intensive - A school that has completed a full comprehensive support cycle, but remains in the lowest-performing 5 percent of schools in Illinois.
